

LANDFIRE Forest Canopy Base Height Attribute Data Dictionary

Attribute	Description
Value	Forest canopy base height (CBH) describes the lowest point in a stand where there is sufficient available fuel (\Rightarrow .25 in dia.) to propagate fire vertically through the canopy. Specifically, CBH is defined as the lowest point at which the canopy bulk density is ≥ 0.012 kg m ⁻³ .
0	All non - forest values, including herbaceous and most shrub systems and non-burnable types such as urban, barren, snow and ice, and agriculture.
1 - 99	0 - 9.9 meters
100	values ≥ 10 meters and some stands dominated by broadleaf species
Count	number of pixels for the corresponding value
cbh_m_x_10	display attribute, cbh is m*10
Non-forested	Value is 0
CBH > 100	Value is 100
