

## LANDFIRE Forest Canopy Base Height Attribute Data Dictionary

Attribute	Description
<b>Value</b>	Forest canopy base height (CBH) describes the lowest point in a stand where there is sufficient available fuel (=> .25 in dia.) to propagate fire vertically through the canopy. Specifically, CBH is defined as the lowest point at which the canopy bulk density is >= 0.012 kg m-3.
0	All non - forest values, including herbaceous and most shrub systems and non-burnable types such as urban, barren, snow and ice, and agriculture.
1 - 99	0 - 9.9 meters
100	values >= 10 meters and some stands dominated by broadleaf species
<b>Count</b>	number of pixels for the corresponding value
<b>cbh_m_x_10</b>	display attribute, cbh is m*10
Non-forested	Value is 0
CBH > 100	Value is 100
